CHANDLER RESIDENT ELECTED TO TOASTMASTERS INTERNATIONAL BOARD

RANCHO SANTA MARGARITA, CA. – Tim Swearingen, of Chandler, Arizona, has been elected to the Board of Directors of Toastmasters International, a worldwide, nonprofit organization teaching skills in public speaking and leadership. He was elected to the two-year volunteer term during the organization's recent International Convention in Calgary.

Swearingen has held a number of distinguished leadership positions within Toastmasters – including that of District Governor. A design manager for the Western Division of Trussway, Ltd. -- one of the nation's largest manufacturers of structural building components – he says Toastmasters has helped him better communicate technical information and make it more understandable to those without that kind of background.

“Applying the skills I've learned in Toastmasters, I've been able to advance my career and take part in numerous professional experiences I might not otherwise have enjoyed,” says Swearingen, who has been an invited speaker and trainer for the National Institute of Building Inspectors.
